<u>Emergency 911 calls – Is your registered cell location up to date?</u>

When you need help you need it now. Is your cell phone registered out of town? To ensure proper routing of 911 calls update your Emergency Address. To streamline 911 response to your location you must change your address in your phone.

GCI: Calls made to emergency services using Wi-Fi Calling will use a "Registered Location". A Registered Location is **the most recent information identifying the physical location of a user.** You can update your Wi-Fi Registered Location for emergency calls by going to your handset settings and updating the address or by contacting GCI at <u>800-800-4800</u>. It is your responsibility to keep this information up to date. Failing to do so may prevent emergency services from being properly routed to your physical location."

AT&T FirstNet: You can change your Emergency Address at any time by selecting "Update Emergency Address" in your Wi-Fi Calling menu. **Do Not Delay. Update** your cell phone address now.
