City of Gustavus, Alaska Ordinance No. FY11-30

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE CITY OF GUSTAVUS PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF CITY ORDINANCE SECTION 6.05.040 GCN ADMINISTRATOR

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GUSTAVUS CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** This ordinance is of general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the City of Gustavus Municipal Code.
- **Section 2. Severability** If any provisions of this ordinance or any application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and its application to other persons, or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.
- **Section 3. Enactment** Now therefore, be it enacted by the Gustavus City Council that Title 6 Section 06.05.040 be amended, as follows. **Bolded and underlined** items are additions, and strikethroughs are deletions.

Section 6.05.040 GCN Administrator <u>and Maintenance and Operations</u> <u>Managers</u>

There shall be a GCN Administrator and Maintenance and Operations (M&O)

Manager responsible for managing GCN in accordance with resolutions and ordinances adopted by the City Council. The GCN Administrator and M&O Manager positions may be filled by either a City employee subject to City personnel ordinances and policies or by a vendor under contract with the City subject to the provisions of the appropriate administrative or M&O contract. The GCN Administrator and M&O Manager shall report to the Mayor or the Mayor's delegate designee. Like other city staff, the GCN Administrator shall be subject to City personnel ordinances and policies. However, The City shall seek and consider recommendations from the GCN board in selecting the GCN Administrator and M&O Manager. The City shall seek and consider recommendations from the GCN Board.

The GCN Administrator shall be responsible for day-to-day operations of including technical support, customer service, billing and collections, and management of any GCN employees, contractors, vendors, and/or volunteers. In addition, the GCN Administrator shall serve as the staff for the GCN Board and assist the board in its duties. The M&O Manager shall maintain and operate the city owned GCN equipment.

In addition, the GCN Administrator shall serve as the staff for the GCN Board and assist the board in its duties.

The City of Gustavus is seeking a contracted vendor to provide maintenance and operation services for the Gustavus Community Network (GCN) for fiscal year 2012 (July 1^{st,} 2011 through June 30th, 2012) with the option for renewing under the same terms for the following fiscal year, FY13.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: The City is seeking a qualified applicant to maintain and operate the city-owned network know as GCN consisting of various wired and wireless network equipment, communication links, and servers providing Internet access, email, and back-end authorization, authentication, and accounting services.

Services would include labor only, specifically network management, system administration, configuration, troubleshooting, repair, monitoring, and advanced technical support, collectively referred to as maintenance and operations.

This applicant will not provide services supplied by the GCN Administrator which is provided for under a separate agreement.

GCN Maintenance and Operations Manager will be chosen based on experience and professional qualifications. GCN shall compensate M&O Manager for services rendered with a percentage of net receipts (payments minus refunds) as recorded in the GCN billing system with this percentage to be determined through negotiations between the vendor and the City.

A. Customer service, basic technical support, billing, account management, and supervision known as "GCN Administration" and provided by a separate agreement;
B. Specialized maintenance of GCN's servers and billing system provided by a third party under a separate maintenance agreement;
C. Installation of new equipment and expansion of the network, other than repairs.
4. GCN shall compensate for services rendered at the rate of% of net receipts (payments minus refunds), as recorded in the GCN billing system, payable monthly in arrears.
5. This agreement is for fiscal year 2012: July 1 st , 2011 to June 30 th 2013. It will terminate on June 30 th of 2012 or upon 30 days notice of cancellation by either party to the other. If mutually accepted, the City and the contractor may renew the contract under the same terms for the following fiscal year, FY2013

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council that Resolution 2010-20 is hereby repealed; and

CITY OF GUSTAVUS SALMON RIVER BOAT LAUNCH FACILITY EXHIBIT 1

SECTION 1. LAUNCH FEES

A. Private Users

Annual private launch fees are due and payable in the amount of \$50.00 for the calendar year to allow maximum utilization of the Salmon River Boat Launch.

B. Commercial Vessel/Charter Operators

Annual commercial vessel/charter operator's fees are due and payable January 1st every calendar year beginning January 1, 2010, to allow maximum utilization of the Salmon River Boat Launch.

Commercial vessel/charter operators will be charged \$100.00 per boat/per year based on unlimited use of the boat launch facility.

C. Freight Carriers

Annual freight carrier fees are due and payable January 1st every calendar year beginning January 1, 2010, to allow maximum utilization of the Salmon River Boat Launch.

Carriers will be charged on a per use rate for use of either the ramp barge ramp or the landing craft ramp.

A rate of \$100.00 per landing for landing craft vessels and \$500 per landing for barge vessels will be paid to the City for each use.

Freight carriers shall make arrangement with the City for the payment of their freight carrier fees in a manner acceptable to the City.

STORAGE RATES AND FEES

A. Storage Area

The storage area is for marine-related items, boats and boat trailers only. Storage fees are due and payable September 1 every calendar year to allow for maximum utilization of the Salmon River Boat Launch storage area.

A fee of \$150.00 per year will be charged for use of a 10' x 75' (750 square feet) storage area for users in good standing. Misuse of the area (City of Gustavus Ordinance 8.06.8 through 8.06.11) will result in additional fees and possible revocation of storage area use. (City of Gustavus Ordinance 8.07.2 through 8.08)

Individuals or businesses may lease all of the storage area located west of the Gustavus Disposal and Recycling Center, subject to the approval of the City Council. All buildings shall be moveable i.e. on skids. A fee rate of \$.25 per square foot/per year will be established. Fees shall be due and payable September 1 every calendar year. In accordance with City of Gustavus Ordinance 10.06.10-10.070.03 leases will be subject to renewal annually.

Misuse of the area (<i>City of Gustavus Ordinance 8.06.8 through 8.06.11</i>) and non-payment will result in additional fees being assessed as per City of Gustavus Ordinance. (<i>City of Gustavus Ordinance 8.07</i>).

Memorandum of Understanding

Between

State of Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities
Maintenance and Operations, Southeast Region

And

City of Gustavus

For

Mutual Aid and Assistance during Emergency or Non-routine Situations

ARTICLE I. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

The State of Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT & PF), Southeast Region and the City of Gustavus hereby enter into an agreement to provide mutual aid and assistance throught the sharing of personnel, facilities, equipment, and materials upon request during emergency or non-routine situations. This does not exclude the possibility of putting the agreement into effect during non-emergence circumstances shout both parties agree. This agreement limits the resources (personnel, equipment, and materials) to those available in Gustavus Alaska.

ARTICLE II. STATEMENT OF WORK

All requests for assistance shall be directed to the Mayor of Gustavus or the Chief of Maintenance and Operations, Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. In those circumstances when the Mayor of Gustavus or the Chief of Maintenance and Operations are not available, assistance may be authorized by the Deputy Mayor or designated City Council person, or the Gustavus Station Foreman, Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.

This agreement shall allow for the following type of aid:

- 1. Assistance of personnel, facilities, equipment and materials to perform maintenance including the following:
 - a. Grading road surfaces, hauling materials, and equipment usage.
 - b. Snow removal from roadways and shoulders
 - c. Snow removal from airport runway, taxiway, ramp and parking areas.
 - d. Sanding of roadways, airport runway, taxiway, ramp and parking areas.
 - e. Brush cutting of roadways, airport runway, taxiway, ramp and parking areas.
 - f. Ditching of roadways and airport property

- g. Bridge maintenance and repairs
- h. Float and dock maintenance and repairs.
- 2. Assistance of personnel and materials for equipment repairs.
- 3. Assistance of personnel, equipment, and materials in environmental emergencies.
- 4. Agree to joint planning and execution of projects, including or requiring mobilization of specialized equipment, contractors, hauling and barging, purchasing of materials, when both parties agree to the benefits of such activities.

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities and the City of Gustavus shall indemnify and hold each other, their respective employees, officers, agents, contractors and assigns harmless from all liabilities of any nature resulting from injuries or damages sustained to any persons or properties, resulting from the execution of this agreement.

Neither party shall be unreasonable during the term of this agreement.

ARTICLE III. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall be effective from the date of the last signatory for a period of five (5) years or until terminated by either party in accordance with Article VI.

ARTICLE IV. KEY OFFICIALS

The key officials representing the City of Gustavus will be the Mayor of Gustavus, Deputy Mayor of Gustavus or designated City Council person.

The key officials representing the Sates of Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities Southeast Region will be Chief of Maintenance and Operations and the Gustavus Station Foreman.

ARTICLE V. PROPERTY UTILIZATION

Each party to this agreement shall retain ownership of the equipment they provide during an emergency or other authorized request for assistance. Each party shall be responsible for the cost of repairs and /or maintenance of their equipment.

ARTICLE VI. TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this agreement by providing 30 days advance written notice to the other party.

ARTICLE VII. STANDARD CLAUSES

Required Provisions

- 1. - 5. LOBBYING PROHIBITION: The parties will abide by the provisions of 18 U.S.C. 1913 (Lobbying with Appropriated Moneys), which states:

No part of the money appropriated by any enactment of Congress shall, in the absence of express authorization by Congress, be used directly or indirectly to pay for any personal service, advertisement, telegram, telephone, letter, printed or written matter, or other device, intended or designed to influence in any manner a Member of Congress, to favor or oppose, by vote or otherwise, any legislation or appropriation by Congress, whether before or after the introduction of any bill or resolution proposing

such legislation or appropriation: but this shall not prevent officers or employees of the United States or of its departments or agencies from communicating to Members of Congress on the request of any Member or to Congress, through the proper official channels, requests for legislation or appropriations which they deem necessary for the efficient conduct of the public business.

Section 6.02.010 Fire Department Established

There shall be a Fire Department in and for the City of Gustavus, Alaska, to be known as the Gustavus Volunteer Fire Department (GVFD), and that shall comply with all Rrules and Rregulations pertaining to fire and emergency medical services (EMS) as set forth in 13 AAC 52.030, Standards of Organization and Services of a Fire Department. It shall consist of a Fire Chief and as many other officers, firefighters, and EMS, hazmat and search and rescue (SAR) responders as the Chief deems appropriate for the effective operation of the department. Members of the fire department may include both paid and unpaid individuals.

Section 6.02.020 Service Area

- a. The Gustavus Volunteer Fire Department shall serve as the primary emergency response agency within Gustavus City limits.
- b. The Fire Chief has the authority to negotiate with ordinance of ratification by the City Council, to enter into mutual aid agreements and contracts with other agencies mutual aid agreements and memorandums of agreement or understanding, for signature by the Mayor after approval by the City Council.

Section 6.02.030 Fire Chief

- a. The department shall be supervised by the Fire Chief, who shall be appointed by the Mayor, with input from GVFD volunteers and/or an advisory or search committee, and with confirmation by the City Council. from candidates recommended by the Gustavus Volunteer Fire Department Committee. The Fire Chief shall be a person who is technically qualified by training and who has the managerial experience and has the ability leadership skills to administer and command the Fire Department.
- b. The Fire Chief shall determine the number and kind of **divisions and** companies of which the Fire Department shall be composed; and shall determine the response of such companies **these units** to alarms.
- c. The Fire Chief shall appoint all other officers and firefighters/EMS/hazmat/SAR responders. Such appointments will follow fair and impartial examinations. All paid positions within the Department shall be established by the Council and shall be staffed in accordance with City of Gustavus employment ordinances and policies and procedures. All officers shall be accountable to the Fire Chief or to the Fire Chief's representative.
- d. The Fire Chief shall at least once <u>twice</u> a <u>each</u> month provide for suitable drills or instruction in the operation and handling of equipment, in the area of EMS, rescue work, salvage, preplans, fire prevention, water supplies, <u>and</u> all other matters generally considered essential to good fire suppression and safety of life and property.
- e. The Fire Chief shall assist the proper authorities in suppressing the crime of arson by investigating or initiating the investigation of the cause and origin of fires within the City limits as required by 13 AAC 52.030 (b-4).
- f. The Fire Chief shall see that the complete records are kept of all apparatus, equipment, personnel, training, fires, preplans, and other department activities.

- g. Reports.
 - 1. Current records and comparative data for previous years and recommendations for improving the effectiveness of the Fire Department shall be included in an annual report to the City Council on March 1. The Fire Chief shall make periodic reports to the City Council, as scheduled by the Council, providing updates on the volunteer roster, participation in drills, frequency and type of call-outs, the status of equipment, grant and training opportunities, the budget, and other items considered pertinent by the Fire Chief.
 - 2. Incident reports will be filed with the State Fire Marshal <u>as</u>
 requested and scheduled by the State Fire Marshal.
 within the first ten (10) days of the month following the month in which the incident occurred. If an incident report is made by computer disc, the report must be submitted quarterly with reports due on January 10, April 10, July 10, and October 10 for the previous quarter.
- h. The Fire Chief shall arrange for the services of a medical director and shall coordinate with the medical director to provide for safety, effectiveness, and legal compliance in responses to medical emergencies.
- i. The Fire Chief shall prepare, submit, and administer the fire department budget.
- j. The Fire Chief is authorized in accordance with City policy and procedures to develop and submit applications for grant funding to support the fire department and is responsible to recommend to the City Council capital investments and purchases for the effective operation of the department.
- k. The Fire Chief is responsible to safeguard and maintain all property of the fire department.
- 1. The Fire Chief shall develop, maintain, and enforce a comprehensive set of operating procedures or guidelines governing the discipline, training, and operation of the fire department. The Fire Chief shall have the authority to carry out the enforcement of these rules and regulations and is authorized to suspend or remove from service any officer or member.

m. The Fire Chief is responsible for the enforcement within the City of Gustavus of State of Alaska laws as authorized under AS 18.70.090 Enforcement Authority, and AS 18.70.075 Authority of Fire Department Officers; Penalty.

n. The Fire Chief shall perform duties incident to the office and such other reasonable duties as the City Council and/or Mayor may assign.

Section 6.02.040 <u>Provisions for Support of the Volunteer Fire</u> Department

a. Members of the Volunteer Fire Department may organize into a voluntary association with the election of their own officers and bylaws. The functions and duties of the volunteer association shall not interfere with those of regular division officers who are charged with the responsibility for all service activities of the division. The volunteer association shall in no way limit the power of the Fire Chief.

b.

- **a.** Insurance and Workman's Compensation. The City of Gustavus will maintain liability insurance and workman's compensation covering the volunteers on all responses and training. Compensation shall be based on the guidelines set forth in 13 AAC 52.040, Workers Compensation for Volunteer Firefighters.
- c. From time to time, in such amounts as the City Council deems advisable, payments may be made to the volunteer association for the purposes of giving that association funds with which to reimburse members for damaged clothing and other expenses incurred in the line of duty.

d.

- **b.** Private vehicles of volunteers.
 - 1. Each member of the department driving a private vehicle may be issued a suitable insignia to be attached to the vehicle designating him or her as a member of the department.
 - 2. Personal vehicles of department members may be equipped with a flashing blue light requesting right of way over all

other traffic when responding to an alarm, but shall observe all traffic laws.

Section 6.02.050 Equipment

- a. The Fire Chief shall be responsible to the City Council for recommending such apparatus or other fire fighting equipment as may be required to maintain Fire Department efficiency, and for providing suitable equipment for reporting fires or emergencies, and for notifying all members of the department to assure prompt response to such incidents.
- b. All property used by the Fire Department is and remains the property of the City of Gustavus, and all expenses of the Fire Department shall be paid by check upon approval by the City Council according to current purchase order policy and/or ordinance.
- c. The Fire Chief or the Fire Chief's representative shall have the power to assign equipment for the response to calls for outside aid where mutual aid agreements are in force and in other cases only when the absence of such equipment will not jeopardize protection of the City of Gustavus.
