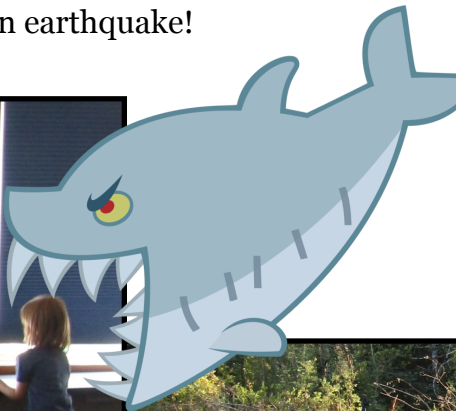

Last Month at a Glance

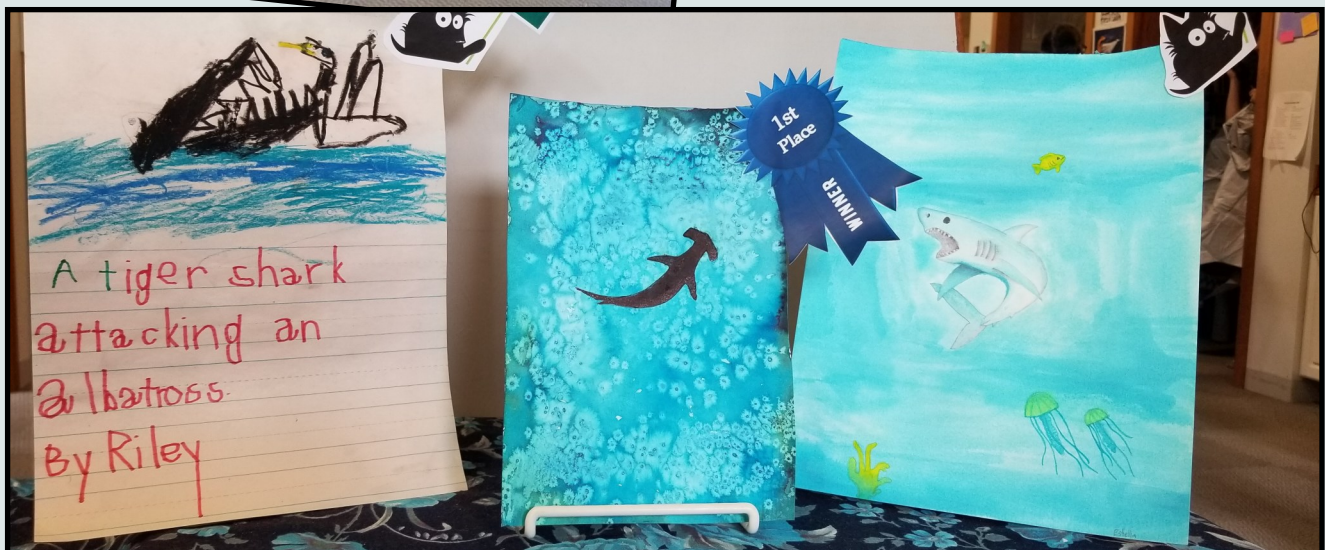


Left: New bags and shirts with the logo designed by Kathy Hocker! These items will be up for sale to help the library fundraise, and some will also be used as prizes for programs!
