





## **April-May 2019 Training Highlights**

### NASA STEM Workshop in Anchorage, AK

Jen attended this state-funded hands-on workshop for librarians, learning how to lead spacethemed science, technology, engineering, and mathematics activities for children, teens, and families, including:

- Creating edible moonscapes
- Building a miniature landing craft that protects marshmallow astronauts upon impact
- Replicating the creation of craters on the moon using flour, cocoa powder, and small objects
- Experimenting with UV-reactive beads
- Cloud identification and solar viewing

### SLICE (Small Libraries Institute of Continuing Education) Leadership Training in Juneau, AK


This state-funded intensive 4-day workshop was part two of a leadership program for library directors working in small libraries in Alaska who do not have a Masters degree. Jen attended this workshop, and learning the following skills:

- Understanding social and emotional intelligence and how it connects to leadership
- Effectively presenting information as a library director through oral presentation skills and PowerPoint
- Creating effective infographics to portray pertinent information about your library
- Project management and effectively implementing grant projects
- Tools for success in rural library programming


## **Summer Story Hour**


## Read with a Ranger

Designed for ages 6 and above.




## **Reading Chart**


