


Our Fall Book Club book is available for checkout! We will be reading **The Complete Persepolis** by Marjane Satrapi. **Persepolis** is a unique

Last Month at a Glance










Top left: A full house for the Alaska Roadless Rule Meeting hosted at the library.

Below: The 4/5 class visits the library for sharpie art and audiobooks.





You may stop by the library and ask for your new card, or wait for it to come to you via the mail!



Check out eBooks and audiobooks for free!


Did you know that you can borrow eBooks and audiobooks free of charge?

The Spaceship Next Door by Gene Doucette


"When a spaceship lands in Sorrow Falls, a lovable and fearless small-town girl is the planet's only hope for survival..."
