
We will also be hosting a few more Halloween-themed events coming up, including Halloween Slime-Making, and some movie showings! See pages 4 and 5.


We are excited to be coordinating with the middle/high school to bring brand new library books into the classroom for students to read!

Ask your librarians for assistance in setting up an account or checking out these resources.








Check in at the library to see our latest read. Anyone is welcome to join, no commitment required. Read the book, come to the discussion, or don't!
