
Library News

The Library is collaborating with the Rookery to host a showing of the documentary, *No Small Matter* on Friday January 17th at 5pm. *No Small Matter* is a film that highlights the importance of quality early learning and child care. The cost of screening this documentary is \$200, and we will be asking for donations to help cover this cost. Visit https://www.nosmallmatter.com/ to learn more about the film.

The Library Bike Shed project has been proposed for the Calendar Year 2020 Capital Improvement Project plan. The previous submission has been significantly changed and requires a resubmission. Previous conceptual designs are not being considered as the building will be designed by an engineering firm. The concept is an open area with bike racks to accommodate 40 bikes and at least 1 picnic table. The demand for the bike barn is increasing as the use of the library increases. It is estimated that 20 bikes can assemble at the library during peak times. The intent of the bike shed is to accommodate 40 bikes (allowing for growth) and 1 or 2 picnic tables for people to sit and talk or use the library wi-fi or cell phone coverage. The project will utilize the most cost-effective materials and labor, including volunteers when permitted.

The library roof repair project is ongoing. We will update you when we have new information.

Jen received a \$500 travel scholarship to attend a training in Anchorage to prep for this year's Summer Reading Program theme, *Dig Deeper*. It's still a long way away, but we have lots of ideas already, and hope to bring you an even better Summer Reading Program this year!

Ask your librarians for assistance in setting up an account or checking out these resources.



The Goal:

How it works:

- 1. Sign your child up at the Gustavus Public Library. You'll receive a packet of information, log sheets, and a prize for signing up.
- 2. Keep track of each book you read on the log sheets. You can track books read to your child by ANYONE (parents, siblings, teachers, librarians, etc).
- 3. Each time you reach a milestone (100 books), bring your log sheet to the library for a prize!
- 4. When you reach your final goal (1,000 books), you'll receive our final prize: a Gustavus Public Library tote bag!




